# **BAGGAGE TRUCK**

Baggage Truck Loading: Will be from 8am this Thursday at Chameleon Touring Systems, South Gate 1, 11 – 13 Percy Street, AUBURN. (The truck will just be inside this gate pictured)

**Loading Days:** Are on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> and Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July, from 8am to 5pm both days. You'll be assisted by Variety Volunteer David Blissett. For the newcomers, we allow spare wheels and swags to be carried on the Baggage Truck free of charge which can be loaded during these times.



Baggage Truck Return: The truck will be back at Chameleon Touring Systems for two days, Monday 12<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> August 8am-5pm for pickups. David Blissett, or any Variety Volunteer, will NOT be in attendance. Variety takes no responsibility for your goods during this period. The left over goods will be returned to our Artarmon office after this. We'll keep an eye on things for a couple of weeks and then anything left will be tossed! WARNING: For your own good, mark things with your name and/or car number. Each year we throw out perfectly good clothes, hats, wigs, sleeping bags and spares such as tyres, without identification markings, just to mention a few things!!










#### NO BAGGAGE TRUCK AT THE START

The Baggage Truck does not come to the start and you won't see it until the afternoon when you arrive in Singleton.

#### **HOW GOOD IS THE START LINE AT BOND!?**

Let me tell you, it's real good. The Bride and I went down there on Sunday for breakfast and a final look over the area we'll be starting from. It was a glorious morning, 17 degrees when we were there at 10am rising to 20 degrees by the time we 'finished our business!'

I watched Sunday's TV news and the weather report for next Sunday is exactly the same. We are in for a cool morning growing into a magnificent day. Make sure you tell your family and friends to come along and join you for this 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary B to B Bash start and meet Dick and Pip Smith in the process!





# ARRIVING AT THE START LINE

When you arrive at Bondi on Sunday morning, you'll basically be coming from the Sydney side and will come down a big left-hand sweeping corner and bingo...there's the famous Bondi Beach in view on the right-hand side.

As you come down the hill, DO NOT turn right at the roundabout and head towards the beach promenade. Keep going 'SO' (straight on) and then 'TR' (turn right) into Beach Road then immediately 'TL' (turn left) into Park Drive North (PDN). This road starts at the yellow gates which will open at 6am. This is where the recyclable bottle station is. There will be Officials there to guide you.

As you drive down PDN there is a pedestrian bridge which is only 2.7 metres high, so make sure you're not flying flags or that your roof decorations aren't this height or higher!

As this area is open for residents to park (with permits) there could well be vehicles parked here overnight. We have to give them passage way out if they need some, so parking will be reversing back into the gutter. We can't block the centre line of the road. We have done a letter drop last week to 2,000 residents to explain we will be there but it will be congested.

#### **TUCKER AT THE START**

We have organised with the Bondi Surf Lifesaving Club's Nippers Association to be in the park doing a sausage sizzle with a 'coffee cart' in attendance.

Also the 'Surf Rider' restaurant, alongside the surf club, are going to open early on Sunday (6.30am) with a 'Basher's Special' Bacon & Egg Roll along with a coffee for \$10.









#### **BASH ENTERTAINMENT**

We have a few things happening in the park at the start line. It kicks off at 8am with the Botany Bay Band, featuring our own K9's Geoff Abrahams on saxophone! They will be followed by the Variety supported 'Bandits' Band who will play through to 9.30am.

During this time we'll have face painting happening along with colourful hair spraying for the kids that come along to see you off.

At 9.30am we start the main proceedings with our MC, Channel 7's Karen Ledbury, who will introduce and talk with special guests, Dick and Pip Smith.

And while all that is happening, Channel 7's Sunrise breakfast show will be doing live weather crosses during the morning.

The first car to go will leave at 10am. That's the start in a nutshell for you.

#### **TOLL PASS**

Yes you will need a toll pass to get out of Sydney. We will be taking the Eastern Distributor (ED) and the Harbour Bridge. The Harbour Bridge, by the way, has a Southbound Toll and we are heading north, so you'll only have the ED toll. If you don't have a toll pass you can make your own way to the Harbour Bridge crossing and pick up the route notes again there.

#### **GOODIE BAG PICK UPS**

We still have some Goodie Bags laying around! Here are the ones still on the floor, A1 7, 8, 65, 74, 302, 351 and 5050.

Remember, we don't take them to the start line for you. If you can't pick them up we will only take your name tags to the start.

#### **WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS**

If you have still not sent your <u>Working With Children Check</u> through to Sally, please forward it to her URGENTLY as soon as it arrives. Please note that we do need these before the Bash starts. #### **HOME HOSTING**

Where accommodation was 'tight' we tried setting up some Home Hosting to help out. This is where we asked you to contact the school and put your name and requirements down. Some have been lucky to have been provided accommodation, others haven't been so lucky!

But don't give up just yet. All four locations will find floor spaces for you, mostly on the floor of school classrooms. We have their largest boat, QSVIII, to enhance our journey out there. Because it's our final day/night of the Bash we are leaving earlier than the normal cruises do. Reason? Due to noise restrictions at the Sheraton Hotel's outside, domed marquee (where we are having our dinner), we have to finish at 10.30pm. This means we'll be starting earlier at 5.30pm with Happy Hour.

#### TRANSPORTING YOUR CAR HOME FROM CAIRNS

We received an update on transport arrangements Basher Joe Cautela has made with the car carrying company. Here is his note, PLEASE read it thoroughly and print this page off to take with you so you have all the details. Job well done Joe!

Good morning Stuart, please find the updated information about transporting of Bash vehicles back from Cairns. At this moment we only have a carrier to transport all vehicles back to Sydney as their country operator has retired some 3 months ago. When vehicles arrive back to Sydney, we then can arrange transport to country NSW for an extra cost. Vehicles going to Melbourne are not affected.

PAYMENTS ARE DUE NOW

BSB: 112 879 ACCT: 43111 2696

When paying, use your car number as a reference, i.e., Car #161

The quoted price of \$1,190.00 is for all vehicles transported back to Sydney at their standard height of 2.1 meters. This standard height is based on a Toyota Landcruiser. I am guessing that 90% of vehicles will be under this. In years gone past, owners took items off their roofs and placed them in their vehicles. If there is any vehicles above this 2.1 meters, we will still transport your vehicle back and a price difference will be charged at a later date. I don't know what that is at the moment, but history tells me it will be around the \$250 to \$300 extra to Sydney. This is due to the fact your vehicle will be placed on a flatbed truck with 2 others opposed to a full 9 car transport truck.

Drop off details are as follows, your vehicles need to be dropped off at Alfie's Towing at 46 Supply Road, Bentley Park QLD 4869 (Cairns). The office is opening from 8.00am to 3.30pm MON to FRI ONLY!!! The contact number there is (07) 4045 1463, Melanie will be your contact there. Melanie will have 2 lists of vehicles returning back home, the first list is an urgent list of 12 cars needed to be transported back. These vehicle must and will be transported first. We are hoping that all vehicles will be back within 2 to 3 weeks. The pickup address is CEVA Minto at 3/5 Culverston Road Minto NSW 2566, PH (02) 8787 2999. They will call you once your vehicle arrives in their yard.

When you drop off your vehicle please list any WRITTEN starting instructions that may be needed. Please make sure that your vehicle has at least one quarter tank of fuel. The driver's seat must be clear of any items. You can have your personal items left in your vehicle, however no reasonability taken. Most important, if you have the time please take photos of your vehicle while you are at the towing yard of any damages you may have. Pictures tell no lies! But these photos need to be taken there.

If you decide to not drive your vehicle back for whatever reason you must contact me first so as I can put your vehicle on the transport list. They will not allow your vehicle to be dropped off if it's not on their list. Alfie's Towing is a contractor that is only holding the vehicles before they get collected.








#### FINAL NIGHT AUCTION ITEM
