Eli Cook: Breathing Easier and Swinging into Joy

Eli is a 6-year-old boy living with Level 5 Quadriplegic Cerebral Palsy, PPP3CA — a rare condition causing severe refractory epilepsy. The only child in Australia diagnosed with this condition, Eli also has global developmental delay and low muscle tone.

To keep Eli safe, suction machines are essential to help him breathe easily. But beyond the critical medical need, Eli also deserves to experience the simple joys of childhood.

When no funding was available for both his medical and play equipment, Variety NT stepped in to bridge the gap. Through Variety NT's support, Eli received the suction machines he needs to breathe safely — and a backyard swing to fill his days with joy.

Pine Creek School: Building Learning and Play

A small semi remote school 92 kilometres from Katherine and 200 from Darwin, Pine Creek School not only hosted the Variety NT Bash but also received a much-needed Bash Grant to support its students.

Thanks to the Bash Grant, Pine Creek School now has not one but two cubby houses — perfect for fostering outdoor play and creativity. In addition, the school received \$1,000 worth of Lego and other interactive toys, providing plenty of opportunities for the children to play, build and learn.





Variety Ability Unleashed Kids

In 2024, Disability Sports Australia delivered 9 Ability Unleashed Kids days across the NT for children aged 5-18 years with sensory, physical or intellectual disabilities. The kids get to try different adapted sports in a fun, safe and inclusive environment. In 2024, thanks to a grant from Variety NT, the program was extended to kids outside the Darwin Urban areas with 9 events including Tiwi Islands and Ngukurr.

Scholarship – Friends of School Sport

Variety NT Helping NT Track and Field Stars of Tomorrow!

In late November, three students from the NT travelled to Launceston to compete in the School Sport Australia Track and Field Championships. Mia Dempsey, Riak Yolo and Rooki Worthington competed against the best of Australia's athletes with a disability in the 10-12 year age group.

Competing at the highest level for the first time was an amazing experience for all three and, in some cases, the first time they had direct competition with students with the same disability classification. All three competed with distinction, setting a number of personal bests in their events. A highlight for the team was Mia Dempsey, who achieved the first medal for the whole NT team. Mia won a Bronze medal in the 4 x 100m multiclass relay competing with 3 students students from other states. This was a huge thrill not only for Mia but for the whole team.





Scholarship – Blake Cook

Blake is a determined 10-year-old who lives with his parents and older brother at Bauhinia Downs Station. His family lease this property and make a living off feral buffalo and cattle. Blake and his brother attend School of the Air, balancing their education with life in the outback.

Thanks to a Variety NT Scholarship, Blake enjoyed an incredible opportunity to represent Australia at the Junior World Titles in Saddle Bronc in Las Vegas. This life-changing experience allowed Blake to showcase his talent on the world stage while proudly representing his community and country.

Variety Adventure Camp at Goanna Park: 24 Years of Inclusion and Joy

During the June–July school holidays, Variety NT hosted its 24th annual Adventure Camp at Goanna Park. This week-long camp is designed for teenagers with disabilities aged 13 to 18, offering them an incredible opportunity to build confidence, try new activities and create lifelong memories.

Each camper is paired with a Junior Police Ranger in a buddy system that fosters inclusion, friendship and support. With the help of our amazing volunteers, the camp provided a safe and welcoming environment for everyone to thrive.

From fishing and basketball games to talent night performances and splashing around at the Wave Pool, the campers had no shortage of fun activities. While there were countless highlights, the friendships made during the camp were the most treasured moments of all.

This free camp not only benefits the teenagers but also gives families a much-needed break. It's truly inspiring to see the positive impact this experience has on both the campers and the volunteers, making it a highlight of the year for everyone involved.
