You will be delighted to know that we have distributed a stunning \$3,752,332 this year, the second largest allocation in our history through 213 grants which has in turn supported a total of 49,716 children who are sick, disadvantaged or have special needs. We have also achieved a net revenue of \$3,046,966, a truly amazing effort.

This is at the heart of what we do and as supporters of Variety you should be immensely gratified that so many children in our state will be positively impacted by the hard work and generosity of the Variety family.

Innovation is paramount to our ongoing success, I was thrilled that we unveiled new initiatives including our Radiothon, Variety Footy Jet and our partnership with Clipsal 500 Adelaide, all of which were both hugely successful.

To all those who were instrumental in the delivery of such an enviable suite of revenue streams, including our Variety staff, thank you again.

We are outcome driven; the sole reason we create this income is to assist more children in need in South Australia.





Gold Heart award Winner

Variety SA was granted a Variety Gold Heart Award for the highest performing Variety organisation in the world (income over \$2.5 million gross) and presented with the "Gold Heart Award" at the 2015 Variety International Conference. This award recognises the organisation that best demonstrates the following attributes: programs, innovation, financial stability and growth.

The organisation also picked up a Freedom Award for individual grants, many of which relate to wheelchair vehicles for families.

In addition, Variety SA was nominated as a finalist for an Innovation Award for their work in generating new revenue streams, had long time contributor and past 4WD Challenge Chairman, David Ahola, recognised with an International Presidential Citation as well as supporting companies Beatwave and Codan recognised for Media and Corporate contributions respectively.

Hosted in May each year since 1937, the Variety International World Conference unites donors, supporters, board members and other volunteers, sponsors and professional employees from the forty international Variety organisations, who assist children around the world.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Setting off from the Clipsal 500 Adelaide start line the 27th annual SA Variety Bash, which was aptly named "500 Tracks to Loxton", covered a total of 2,496 km on some amazing private property and scenic tracks overnighting in Rawnsley Park, Arkaroola, Cameron Corner, Tibooburra, White Cliffs, Broken Hill and Wentworth before arriving in Loxton eight days later to be welcomed by hundreds of Riverland locals.

This Bash saw the highest number of grants ever distributed en route, twelve altogether totalling over \$200,000 to help children who are sick, disadvantaged or have special needs in the generous and friendly towns and communities visited by Bash entrants.

There were many highlights for the 320 entrants from the grants distributed along the track, the entertainment including the Variety Bash Can Dance competition with guest judge Mark Holden, to the long seafood lunch in Tibooburra, but to top them all was the announcement in Loxton that the 2015 SA Variety Bash had been another record breaking event raising an astonishing \$2.33 million net for our children in need.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

The 2015 Variety SA 4WD Challenge encompassed pretty much everything that you could wish for with a 4WD in South Australia; from the rocky creek beds and the steep ascents and descents of the Flinders Ranges, the tranquillity of the natural spring in the Willochra Creek to the soft sand hills of both the Coffin Bay and Port Lincoln National Parks.

dighlights included Amber Joy Poulton performing with a backdrop of Flood—lit gum trees in Willow Springs, the lookout at Mount Caernarvon, a slow meander through Willochra Creek, a crayfish dinner in the creek bed, Darke Peak, swimming with the tuna, seafood lunch on Seven Mile Beach and a formal dinner in a marquee in the middle of nowhere entertained by party band Platinum Plus.



EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

The 2014 event was a great success! V2 entrants and officials departed Adelaide and journeyed in excess of 2,000km over five days in mostly seautiful sunshine. The route travelled east from Adelaide over the border to Victoria, visiting Stawell, Castlemaine, Shepparton, Beechworth, Mt Beauty, Echuca, Pinnaroo and more. The event raised \$210,000 (net) for children in need in South Australia and although it was a long haul to get there, the day ride around the Victorian Alps certainly lived up to expectations. The weather was kind and the run along the river to Tooleybuc added another dimension. As in the past, amazing sunset parties, good accommodation and great entertainment all contributed to what has been described by the entrants as a "brilliant" event. Mohammad Baltagie and his Dad joined V2er's at the start line, presenting his new modified bicycle funded by Variety which helps with rehabilitation therapy following a fracture and surgery on his leg due to a cancerous tumour.


