Together, with the contribution of so many individuals, we built upon our solid business performance from last year and, thanks to the generosity of South Australians, we were able to achieve \$3.73 per head of population in gross revenue; the highest in Variety worldwide.



"My daughters Emily and Scarlett are amazing little girls with special needs. Emily has autism and Scarlett has cerebral palsy and other health conditions. We live in the country and travel 500 kms a week to medical/therapy appointments for the girls. My old car was dying and could not fit the girls special needs stroller in and I did not have the means to replace it. Living in the country there is no public transport or even taxis. I was desperate when I applied to Variety SA for help. I struggle to put in words how much the car Variety granted us has helped the girls. We can now easily access appointments and just get out and about, something that was so difficult to do before. Their special stroller fits in easily and it is much safer to transfer Scarlett in and out of the car. The girls know our car was given to us by some very special people. They tell us in their own way all the time how much it means to them. We are so grateful for everything Variety has done for the girls and us as a family!"

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

his year, the 28th SA Variety Bash announced an impressive and record breaking \$2.64 million (net) fundraising figure.

100 cars and 350 entrants travelled 2,142 km over eight days from Port Lincoln to Clare (great whites to great whites) benefiting regional areas as the group distributed more than \$500,000 in grants during the journey, as well as injecting tens of thousands of dollars into local communities through the purchase of fuel, accommodation, meals and supplies.

The colourful, costumed cohort covered themes such as Smurfs, Super Mario Brothers, Frozen, Wiggles, Cavemen, Footballers, Golfers and Ghostbusters. Included were 11 official vehicles, 9 mobile workshops, 3 medical vehicles, 2 trucks, 2 media cars, 2 planes for assistance and a communications team all operated by hardworking volunteers who take their own time and pay their own way to help out on the event.

This result brings the total amount raised by the SA Variety Bash to more than \$37 million (net) since its inception.









THE VARIETY RADIOTHON TOOK TO THE AIRWAVES ON FRIDAY, 22 JULY 2016














Port Lincoln Hospital

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT \$113,250


The Port Lincoln Hospital provides paediatric medical care and services throughout the Eyre Peninsula. With one of the highest birth rates at an average of 320 births per year, Variety granted medical equipment to assist nurses, midwives and doctors in providing safe, accurate and effective care to unborn and newborn babies, including an Intellispace Perinatal system for \$103,500 and a jaundice meter for \$7,500 which were proudly presented at our Bash startline in August, 2016.

Operation Flinders Foundation

RATIONS, MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT TO RUN EXERCISES IN 2016 - \$90,000

The Operation Flinders Foundation runs a wilderness adventure program for youth at risk in South Australia. The program has been shown to reduce offending and re-offending behaviour, reduce absences from school and improve attitudes and motivation in the participant. Variety funded rations, materials and equipment to run the exercises in 2016 to the value of \$90,000, taking our overall support

of this program to more than \$1.3m!



Community Living Australia

SUNSHINE COACH \$78,000

Community Living Australia is a regionally based community disability services provider, supporting more than 500 people. There are 37 children in their care, three of whom use wheelchairs for mobility. Variety SA funded a brand new Sunshine Coach with wheelchair lifter, which will be used to facilitate participation in their respite and school holiday programs.

Muscular Dystrophy South Australia

COUGH ASSIST MACHINES \$71,200

Muscular Dystrophy South Australia is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to supporting people living with a neuromuscular condition. Due to the progressive nature of muscular dystrophy, children living with the disease have weakened respiratory muscles. Variety SA funded 10 Cough Assist Machines to the value of \$71,200 to be used to assist the patient to execute a natural cough. These machines have been clinically proven to reduce recurrent respiratory infections.

Gypsy is five years old and lives with Down Syndrome. Variety SA provided funding for an accessible vehicle to enable Gypsy to transfer in and out independently and confidently. It will decrease the risk of injury to her parents who are currently lifting Gypsy in and out of the family vehicle.

Variety Freedom Program

Harley is a Variety SA grant recipient living with cerebral palsy. Due to his condition his postural needs are significant and it is very important that he is transported in his wheelchair, rather than being transferred in and out of a standard vehicle. Variety helped the family by funding a wheelchair accessible vehicle, so that Harley can be transported safely, comfortably and conveniently throughout the community.

Variety has been chosen by Club Clipsal to be their charity of choice for 2016 & 2017. Club Clipsal, Australia's largest loyalty club for the electrical industry, has over 7,000 members.

FGX funding of \$80,160 for FY2016 supported Variety's national scholarships program for children with an existing talent who are disadvantaged or have special needs and who do not have the financial support to excel in their field.

FGX's funding supported 29 scholarships nationally with the average scholarship being \$2,500 per child. Scholarship categories included sport and the arts, academic and even astronomy. Over 150 applications were received from across Australia. In 2016, 43% of scholarships granted were to children who faced socioeconomic marginalisation; and the remaining 57% had special needs.


