In my second year as Chief Barker of this incredible organisation, our vision remains unwavering: to ensure all Tasmanian children reach their full potential, regardless of background or ability. We are dedicated to providing every child with a fair chance, steadfast in our belief that no child should slip through the cracks.

Our programs and initiatives serve as avenues for Variety Tasmania to cultivate a sense of belonging among children. Our collective aim is to foster an inclusive and supportive environment, ensuring that every child in Tasmania can enjoy a life filled with joy, laughter, and learning.

Throughout 2023, Variety Tasmania remained steadfast in assisting the most vulnerable individuals. Despite facing challenges such as increasing living costs, we witnessed significant growth in new initiatives and projects aimed at reaching and positively impacting a greater number of Tasmanian children.

One such initiative, the Variety School Breakfast Club, exemplifies our commitment to reaching and positively impacting our community. By providing nutritious breakfasts to students five days a week, this program funded nearly 20,000 meals, leading to improved behaviour, attendance, and participation in schools across Tasmania.

Additionally, Variety collaborated with Business Events
Tasmania and Solterbeck conference organisers to design and
build an Outdoor Learning Space at Huonville Primary School.
This \$75,000 project, funded by their corporate client, now
provides students with a dedicated area for extracurricular
activities and enhances community engagement.

The Variety Federal Group TasBash further demonstrated our commitment to community inclusion and kindness, raising nearly \$150,000 through the tireless efforts of Bashers, officials and supporters all of whom are volunteers. We also celebrated 30 years of partnership with Federal Group, presenting Mr. Greg Farrell (Jr) with a Variety International Presidential Award in recognition of this milestone.

I would like to acknowledge Ian (Johnno) Johnston, who received the Variety International Presidential Citation Award for his remarkable 30 years of volunteering for Variety.

An extra special thanks to Andrew Lyden and his team at Lyden Builders, Homes Tasmania, and Madison House supporters raised an astounding \$572,466, which will be dedicated to fund the Variety School Breakfast Club and other projects.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the Board, volunteers, corporate and community supporters. With your generosity, Variety Tasmania can continue towards its vision of all Tasmanian children attaining their full potential.

Finally, I would like to thank my friends and family for their support, particularly my wife Jessica and my daughters Sofia and Madeline for letting me support this wonderful charity.

Between October 2022 and September 2023, we've worked hard to support 7,140 Tasmanian children, granting a remarkable \$447,000 to provide life-changing practical assistance, programs, and experiences to kids doing it tough. Over 350 children have already participated in this life-changing program to strengthen emotional literacy, self-awareness, and positive self-identity through creative expression.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to making this past year so successful – your support truly makes a world of difference. We're looking forward to the next chapter of our journey with you. Together, we will continue to bring hope, joy, and practical assistance to the children who need it most.

Kids' Stories

Because numbers only tell part of the story...

Lily

Lily is a lively and cheeky 6-year-old songbird who lives with congenital retinal dystrophy.

Lily discovered a love for music at an early age, so in April 2023 we took Lily and her mum Gemma to the Variety Braille Music Camp in Brisbane. The 4-day camp offers multiple workshops in singing, songwriting, music using braille, playing instruments, even beatboxing workshops. Lily was the youngest of the 35 participants. Her confidence just grew over the short period she was there, and singing became her "thing". She hasn't stopped singing since.

In August, Lily sang her favorite song "A Million Dreams" in front of nearly 350 guests and to a standing ovation at the Variety of Chefs gala ball. Special mention to our friends at the Royal Australian Navy Band, in particular CPO Martyn Hancock CSM and Able Seaman Nikayla Taskinen-Smith who took Lily under their wing to guide and support her along the way.

Lily is now rehearsing "Silent Night" to sing solo at the Variety Carols by Candlelight in front of 1400 people. We are also looking forward to sending the family back to the Braille Music Camp in 2024.

Variety Freya Fund

The Variety Freya Fund is the legacy of Freya Williamson.

The Williamson family, who loved and cared for Freya for 21 years have been inspired by their own lived experiences, to provide assistance for families who have children with severe disabilities.

The fund provides a one-off relief payment of up to \$1,000 for Tasmanian families who care for a child with a disability and are experiencing emotional or financial distress.

It is designed to be as flexible as possible to help relieve individual families, while respecting and upholding their dignity.

The family is nominated by a professional who knows their needs and circumstances.

The Variety Freya Fund gift may be used for anything the family needs. Our recent grant recipients have paid essential bills, bought groceries, and sporting gear.

Our Programs

Variety's Kids Sports Days

We believe every child must have the opportunity to play - regardless of their ability or circumstances.

This year, we were delighted to once again host the Variety's Kids Sports Days to enable kids living with disability to try different sports in a welcoming and inclusive setting.

We held these free, fun and inclusive come and try sports days in Devonport, Launceston and Hobart.

Aimed at kids aged 5-18, the days are an opportunity to have a go in a fun, supportive environment with passionate and qualified coaches on hand.

Afterwards kids are connected with the sport they particularly enjoyed, with the aim that they'll continue playing well beyond the initial experience – enjoying all the social, physical and emotional benefits of sports participation.

Thanks to the ongoing generous support from Commstar Systems, we're delighted to announce this program will continue in 2024 and hopefully well beyond!

Thanks also to Hobart City Council and Devonport City Council for coming on board as event partners. And to all the sporting codes who participated with such enthusiasm.

Variety Motor Mouth Camp

Motor Mouth is three days and two nights camp to help kids who have limited speech, and their families, communicate. It's the only camp of its kind in Tassie and only second to Variety WA in Australia.

The kids coming on camp rely on augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) systems to express themselves but often their siblings and carers aren't as familiar with the devices, so camp is all about creating a super fun environment to learn to use the device to its full potential.

Assisted by a team of volunteer speech pathologists, an occupational therapist, teachers, teacher assistants and university students, AAC was used during all camp activities encouraging the child and their family to fully embrace their system and to incorporate it into their everyday life.

Our volunteer Motor Mouth Camp Committee worked hard all year to prepare for our first camp in early October – we're so grateful for all their hard work. A special thanks to our Camp Co-Ordinator, Speech Pathologist Tracey Hanigan.



Variety School Breakfast Club

Countless Tassie kids start their school day hungry. Either because they've had to rush out the door, they've simply eaten so far in advance of school as they travel significant distances to attend or their household can't afford breakfast.

We all know the best possible start to the day involves a nutritious breakfast - shown to improve problem solving, memory, concentration, and anecdotally, the teachers find the kids are calm and ready to learn.

Variety School Breakfast Club enables schools to deliver a nutritious breakfast five days a week, to all students in their school - to eliminate the stigma of partaking. We also ask schools to invite parents in for a cup of tea and a chat too, to help foster a sense of community.

This year the Variety School Breakfast Club served more than 20,000 kids' breakfasts.

Plans are underway to significantly expand this program in 2024.

21% is the decrease in negative behaviours since the Variety Breakfast Club was implemented in one of our partner schools in early 2022.

A hungry student can easily disengage with their learning program - this can equate to a loss of 1.5 - 2 hours of learning a day - or almost **a full term** in a school calendar year.



Our program gives kids with adverse life experiences an outlet to explore their thoughts, feelings and experiences through arts therapy.

Delivered in small workshops over the course of a school term, the program gives children the opportunity to express themselves in ways that promote healing and growth and help to strengthen their emotional literacy, self-awareness and positive self-identity.

The Variety Creative Arts Program is delivered by qualified creative arts therapists in greater Hobart and greater Launceston who help children to explore, build insight and make meaning of their life experience through their art works.

The therapists use a range of different materials and techniques in a safe and welcoming environment.

Art expression is a form of non-verbal communication that is particularly beneficial for children who may not be able to articulate thoughts, sensations, emotions, or perceptions. It is a way for children to convey anything that may be difficult to express and understand with words.

Since it launched in 2019 the Variety Creative Arts Program has changed the lives of more than 350 children in Bagdad, Clarendon Vale, New Norfolk, Ouse, Triabunna, and St Marys, Goodwood, Punchbowl and South Arm.

This 7-week life-changing program was delivered to more than 200 children this year.

Kyla's journey with Variety came full circle, from a hair donor to receiving a wig from the Variety Hair with Heart program.

Losing your hair can have profound psychological effects, particularly through childhood and adolescence. We provide wigs to kids who have lost their hair due to Alopecia or other long-term medical condition.

One specialised wig can cost up to \$6,000 and lasts two to three years so the cost is prohibitive for many families.

This year the Hair with Heart Program, saw thousands of metres of hair donated and \$1.2M raised nationally through both fundraising and the sale of the donated hair.

We are particularly grateful to our brave hair donors around Australia, like Kyla (pictured). 12-year-old Kyla donated her long locks to our program in 2019.

In February 2020, Kyla's sister found a round bald patch on the top of Kyla's head. What began as the size of a 10c coin, very quickly grew and Kyla was diagnosed with the autoimmune condition, alopecia.

Community Grants

Nature-based learning for Huonville Primary School

Variety Tasmania, with our friends from Business Events Tasmania (BET), proudly instigated this collaboration to develop a meaningful project for the students and community of the Huon Valley. The Huonville Primary School now boasts a new nature-based learning space fostering connections between students and the community.

We were able to create and facilitate the Corporate Social Responsibility project on behalf of BET for their corporate client.

A previously sparse and underutilised area was reimagined as a space where the school can hold assemblies, teach classes, relax and recharge in a beautiful natural environment.

As part of the conference, 260 delegates from across Australia spent a day working on the project site assisting with planting 1200 trees and plants, spreading mulch and gravel - guided by our expert friends at Landscape Solutions Tasmania and Westland Nursery.

This 1400m2 purpose-built space now provides an area for extra-curricular activities for the students and an enchanting space for the local community to enjoy.

Starfish Nippers with Surf Live Saving Tasmania

Surf Life Saving's Starfish Nippers Program is all about helping kids living with disability to safely access the water and join in one of Australia's favourite pastimes – a day out at the beach.

In 2021 we partnered with Surf Life Saving Tasmania for three years, to provide eight clubs with the equipment to set up and run their own Starfish Nippers program each summer, enabling more Tassie kids to safely enjoy our beautiful beaches.

Since then, we have seen an average of over 100 kids each year participate across Tasmania in this genuinely life changing program – with smiles aplenty and confidence growing after each session.

Kids take part in classic surf lifesaving activities swimming, catching waves, beach runs and exercises with their volunteer surf lifesaving buddy.

A huge thank to the teams of dedicated volunteer lifesavers from Surf Life Saving Clubs around Tasmania who are buddies to each of our Starfish Nippers each season.

Tassie Mums

Tassie Mums provide essential baby and children's items to social service organisations across Tassie that work with vulnerable and at-risk children.

We're proud to partner with Tassie Mums to allow them to increase their weekly operational hours at their headquarters – where they sort and pack donations of quality clothes, toys and other items for babies and children.

This \$15,000 grant enabled Tassie Mums to reach an additional 390 vulnerable and at-risk children throughout 2023.





An Inclusive Playground for Devonport

We're working with the local Devonport community to deliver Tasmania's first Variety Livvi's Place - an inclusive play space for kids and kids at heart of all ages and abilities to play side by side.

City of Devonport Council have committed \$500,000 to the project, thanks to Variety's lobbying in conjunction with the Touched by Olivia Foundation.

We look forward to realising this dream in 2024.

In 2022 Communities Tasmania and Lyden Builders partnered to build the 9th Madison House. Funds were raised thanks to Communities Tasmania guaranteeing at-cost construction funding and the in-kind support of Lyden Builders and many local trades and suppliers.
