Selena's Story

"School is a pain" takes on a completely different meaning for Selena, who experiences extreme fatigue and physical pain when writing due to a congenital joint disorder.

Selena was born with a number of conditions that limit the range of motion of her joints and movement of some of her limbs, along with weakness in her wrists, hands and feet. As well as causing her pain when writing, Selena misses out on time in the classroom to undergo a number of operations, making it difficult for her to keep up with her peers.

Thanks to your support, Variety WA was able to provide Selena with a brand new laptop, so she can write her notes without experiencing pain and stay up-to-date with school work outside of the classroom. Selena loves her laptop and is feeling more confident every day.

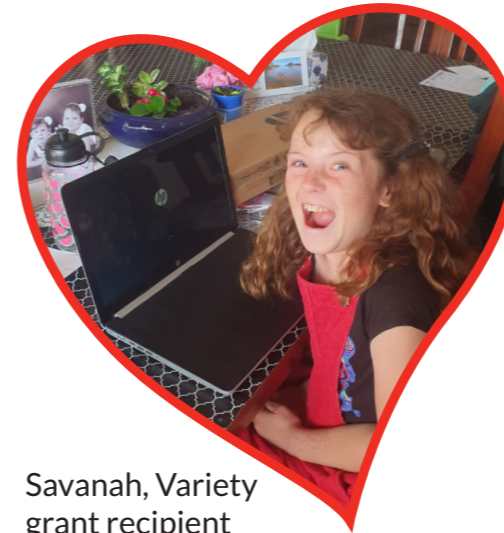

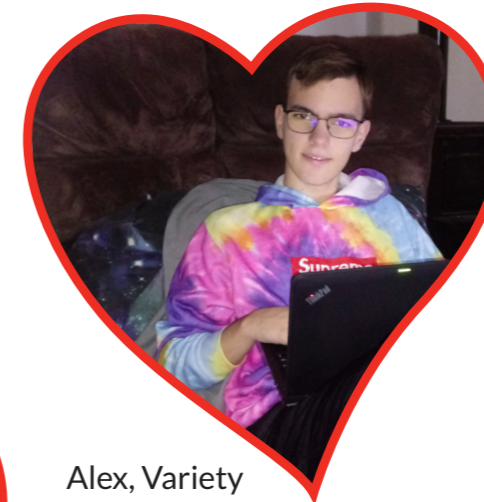

Variety Choir



The Variety Choir continued to entertain and inspire this year with an uplifting repertoire that brings joy to both the audience and performers. Comprised of over 30 young people of all abilities and backgrounds, the Choir uses music as a foundation for building performance skills, self-confidence, friendship and community participation.

Prior to COVID-19, the Choir performed all over Perth, and even had the opportunity to open the Perth Scorchers Big Bash at Optus Stadium to an audience of many thousands.

In response to COVID-19 restrictions, Choir Director, Gemma Luxton continued to run choir rehearsals online to maintain a sense of routine and provide a regular opportunity for participants to connect and flourish, despite the challenging times. Choir rehearsals have now resumed at the prestigious WAAPA Music Auditorium.

Variety Kids Xmas Party

Over 800 kids and family members spent the day splashing in the pools, squealing on the rides and hurtling down the water slides at the 2019 Variety Kids Xmas Party, held at Adventure World for the very first time.

A highlight of the day was a visit from Santa, who greeted and took a professional family photo with every child, which was printed on the day as a special keepsake. Each child also received a special gift and hand-written card from a Variety WA supporter, to bring joy beyond the day itself.

Variety Heart Scholarships

Fifty-three kids living with disability, disadvantage or illness were supported to pursue their passions this year, with more than \$111,000 in scholarships granted.

The scholarships were awarded to 33 children engaged in the arts, with the remaining 20 helping young people chase their goals in sports; ranging from race walking and cheerleading to football and athletics.

40 years of Variety WA

2020 marked the 40th anniversary of Variety – the Children’s Charity helping kids in WA. Since 1980, we’ve stayed true to our mission to empower WA kids who are sick, disadvantaged or living with disability to live, laugh and learn.

Every year since our inception, we’ve helped thousands of WA kids and their families with nowhere else to turn, and would otherwise miss out on the opportunities that every child deserves. This milestone was celebrated in style with the return of the 2020 Variety Ball.

Variety Ball: A night at the circus

The 2020 Variety Ball was a spectacular evening under the stars at the Mounts Bay Sailing Club, raising an incredible \$250,000 for WA kids in need.

The evening paid tribute to Variety’s roots in the entertainment industry, with a surprise performance choreographed by Dancing With the Stars celebrity, Carmelo Pizzino, along with the Variety Choir, a live band, DJ and more.

A highlight of the evening was a solo performance by talented Variety Heart Scholarship recipient, Joshua White. 14-year-old Joshua is a classical singer and performed a heart-wrenching repertoire to the audience of more than 400 guests.

Impact of COVID-19 on fundraising events

Thanks to the generosity of the Western Australian community, WA kids in need were still able to access Variety WA’s support through the year, despite having to cancel three of our largest annual fundraising events in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The cancellation of the iconic Variety Bash and the Variety 4WD Adventure alone saw \$800,000 in fundraising lost, placing significant pressure on operations.

Making sure that we could be there for our Variety kids and families at a time when they need help the most, Variety WA received a much needed funding boost of \$297,444 thanks to the Lotterywest COVID-19 Relief Fund.

A further \$23,000 was donated to Variety’s COVID-19 Emergency Appeal, including a \$10,000 special donation from long time sponsor, P&N Bank.

Sometimes, it takes a whole community to help the kids!

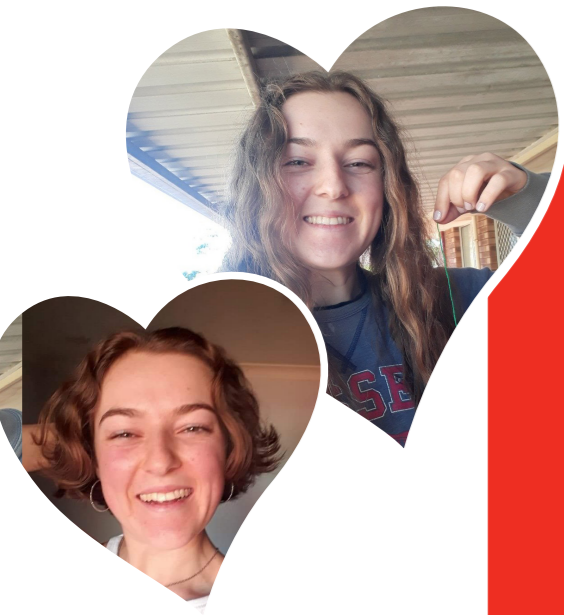

Variety Goldfields

The annual Geoff Kemp Memorial Golf Day in March was a smashing success, raising over \$110,000 for Variety WA, in addition to the annual Kalgoorlie Race Day which raised an amazing \$33,000. Circumstances might have prevented the Goldfields from running their full array of popular community events in 2020, but it couldn't dampen their enthusiasm for fundraising for WA kids in need. We thank the Kalgoorlie crew and the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Chamber of Commerce and Industry for their powerhouse efforts.

Variety Toy Bank

Variety Toy Bank raised \$24,086 and received donations of 219 toys and 56 experiences to support kids in women's refuges across the state. Funds and donations were received through two iconic annual events; the Variety Toy Bank White Party and Hamptons Luncheon, while the sell-out Rockpool Luncheon was forcibly cancelled. A huge thanks to the volunteer committee who made this possible.

Variety Midwest

Despite the event limitations caused by COVID-19, Variety Midwest raised \$12,000 through their annual Melbourne Cup Sweep, which is a key item on Geraldton's social calendar.

The 2019 Variety Midwest Kids Xmas Party brought so much joy to the almost 500 kids and families, with food, entertainment, games and gifts for all kids who attended. Santa and other mystical characters helped make the inclusive event extra special for those who attended.

A big thank you to the committee, president and all involved for making this possible.
